Mr. President:

The Education Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **S.B. 42**, EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION, by Senator A. Osmond, with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 14 through 15:
 - establishes the High Quality Preschool Pilot Program to fund certain preschool
 programs to { serve at-risk } intergenerational poverty students;
- 2. Page 2, Lines 30 through 31:
 - 30 Programs, as an ongoing appropriation:
 - from the Education Fund, {\$6,000,000} <u>\$3,000,000</u>.

3. Page 4, Lines 98 through 105:

- 98 (5) "Eligible student" means a student who:
- 99 (a) lives in the attendance boundaries of an eligible LEA;
- 100 (b) is economically disadvantaged; and

 is classified as a child affected by intergenerational poverty
