Chair Dunnigan called the meeting to order at 8:05 a.m.

H.B. 113 Pharmacy Benefit Manager Amendments (*Rep. B. Last*)

MOTION: Rep. Peterson moved to replace H.B. 113 with 2nd Substitute H.B. 113. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Anderegg, Rep. Anderson, Rep. Bird, Rep. Duckworth, and Rep. Froerer absent for the vote.

H.B. 205 Product Labeling Amendments (Rep. B. Greene)

MOTION: Rep. Anderegg moved to amend H.B. 205 as follows:

45 food products for purchase ~~{-}~~ ;and

(c) to not cause any unnecessary increase in the price of genetically modified
food.

= (a) receive and consider input from:

modified food labeling law;

(b) evaluate evidence-based data pertaining to genetically modified food;
