



- 30 (i) the county commission form under Section 17-52-501;
- 31 (ii) the expanded county commission form under Section 17-52-502;
- 32 (iii) the county executive and council form under Section 17-52-504; or
- 33 (iv) the council-manager form under Section 17-52-505.
- 34 (b) An optional plan adopted after May 1, 2000 may not:
- 35 (i) propose changing the form of government to a form not included in Subsection
- 36 (1)(a);
- 37 (ii) provide for the nonpartisan election of elected officers;
- 38 (iii) impose a limit on the number of terms or years that an elected officer may serve;
- 39 or
- 40 (iv) provide for elected officers to be subject to a recall election.
- 41 (2) In addition to proposing the adoption of any one of the optional forms of county
- 42 government under Subsection (1)(a), an optional plan may also propose the adoption of any
- 43 one of the structural forms of county government provided under Chapter 35b, Part 3,
- 44 Structural Forms of County Government.
- 45 (3) A county that provided for the election of the county's elected officers through a
- 46 partisan election in or after the 2000 general election may not change to a process that provides
- 47 for the election of the county's elected officers through a nonpartisan election.
