30	[(1) As used in this section, "rules of order and procedure" means a set of rules that

36	(a) "Disaster" means an event that:
37	(i) causes, or threatens to cause, loss of life, human suffering, public or private property

40	(ii) requires resources that are beyond the scope of local agencies in routine responses
