Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section 26-53-501 is enacted to read:

26-53-501. Liability.

~~fAn~~ (1) A nonprofit amateur sports organization or an agent of ~~fAn~~ a nonprofit amateur sports organization may not be held liable for injuries or future medical conditions related to an injury suffered by an athlete during a sporting event sponsored by the amateur sports organization if:

~~(f1)a~~ (a) the injury is the result of an inherent risk of the activity; or

(b) the amateur sports organization and the participating team or club has a policy in place consistent with this chapter ~~f; and~~

~~(2) the policy was followed and documented at the time of the injury.~~

(2) The failure of the participating team or club to follow the policy does not affect the immunity of the nonprofit amateur sports organization but may affect the immunity of the team or club.
