Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
WHEREAS, parents have the fundamental right to direct their children's educations;
WHEREAS, parents have the fundamental right to contribute to the education standards
set for their children;

WHEREAS, parents have the fundamental right to see their children's curriculum;
