- (7) The Legislature shall [provide for an annual adjustment in] annually adjust the appropriation authorized [under this section] for the program in proportion to the increase in the number of students [in the state] in kindergarten through grade [eight] 8 statewide.
- (8) (a) To qualify for [class size reduction] <u>program</u> money, [a school district or charter school] an LEA shall submit:
- (i) [a] the LEA's plan [for the use of the school district's or charter school's allocation of class size reduction money] to the [State Board of Education] board describing how the LEA will use the LEA's program money; and
