**H.B. 269      Tourist-oriented Highway Signing Program (Rep. M. Noel)**

June 1, 1991, for the display of logo  
49 advertising and information of interest to the traveling public if:

55 (ii) only on rural conventional roads as defined in rules adopted in  
accordance with Section 41-6a-301 in a county of the fourth, fifth, or sixth class for  
tourist-oriented directional signs that display logo

3. Page 2, Line 58:

58 the lease or other contract agreement with a private party for the tourist-oriented  
directional sign or sign space; and

4. Page 3, Lines 63 through 65:

63 maintaining the signs or sign spaces.

March 1, 2015, shall be permitted as if it were in compliance with this Subsection  
(2).
