SOLID FUEL BURNING AMENDMENTS

Representative **Joel K. Briscoe** proposes the following amendments:

1. *Page 2, Lines 28 through 30:*

28 (a) public awareness campaign ~~{, in consultation with representatives of the solid fuel~~
29 ~~burning industry,}~~ on best wood burning practices and the effects of wood burning on air
30 quality, specifically targeting nonattainment areas; ~~[and]~~

2. *Page 2, Lines 43 through 56:*

43 (c) shall prohibit burning in a nonattainment area during periods when monitored
44 levels of air pollutants are forecast within the next 48 hours to be greater than 15 micrograms
45 but less than 35 micrograms per cubic meter of fine particulate matter PM2.5, unless using a
46 solid fuel burning device that is:

47 ~~{(i)(A) certified by the United States Environmental Protection Agency;}~~

48 ~~{(B)}~~ (i)(A) a wood heater that can only burn wood pellets; or

49 ~~{(C)}~~ (B) a masonry heater built to specifications of the American Society for Testing
50 Materials ASTM - 1602, "Standard Guide For Construction of Solid Fuel Burning Masonry
51 Heaters"; and

52 (ii) operated in a manner that produces no visible smoke, except during a 15 minute
53 period when:

54 (A) a fire is started in the device; and

55 ~~{(B) fuel is added to the device; and}~~

56 ~~{(C)}~~ (B) a fire is being extinguished in the device;
