- 1. Page 1, Lines 19 through 22:
 - This bill appropriates for fiscal year 2016:
 - to the Department of Environmental Quality Division of Air Quality, as a one-time
 - 21 appropriation:
 - from the General Fund, <u>one-time</u>, \$70,000 to fund modeling.
- 2. Page 2, Lines 44 through 47:
 - 44 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (2)(a), the division shall:
 - 45 (i) allow burning during local emergencies and utility outages; and
 - 46 (ii) provide for exemptions, through registration with the division for:
 - 47 (A) devices that are sole sources of heat; or
- 3. Page 3, Lines 69 through 74:
 - 69 (2) the impact of a program to encourage citizens to replace unapproved solid fuel
 - 70 burning devices in their homes { for } with EPA-certified devices and other low-emission devices for
 - 71 solid fuel burning.
