12 This bill supplements or reduces appropriations previously provided for the use and
13 operation of state government for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016 and ending June 30, 2017.

14 **Highlighted Provisions:**

15 This bill:

- 16 ▶ provides budget increases and decreases for the use and support of certain state agencies
17 and institutions of higher education;
- 18 ▶ authorizes certain state agency fees;
- 19 ▶ authorizes internal service fund rates;
- 20 ▶ adjusts internal service fund full-time equivalent employment;
- 21 ▶ adjusts funding for the impact of Internal Service Fund rate changes; and,
- 22 ▶ provides budget increases and decreases for other purposes as described.
