53A-26a-101. Title.
This chapter is known as the "Interpreter Services for the [Hearing Impaired] Deaf or
Hard of Hearing Act."
Section 2. Section <b>53A-26a-102</b> is amended to read:
53A-26a-102. Definitions.
As used in this chapter:
[(1) "Advisory board" or "board" means the Interpreters Certification Board created in
<del>Section 53A-26a-201.</del> ]
(1) "Board" means the State Board of Education.
(2) "Certified interpreter" means [a person] an individual who is certified as meeting
the certification requirements of this chapter.
(3) "Certified transliterator" means an individual whose national certification is
recognized by the ICB.
[(3)] (4) (a) ["Hearing impaired"] "Deaf or hard of hearing" means a hearing loss
[which] that:
[(a)] (i) necessitates the visual acquisition of language; or
[(b)] (ii) adversely affects, but does not preclude, communication and the auditory
acquisition of language [but which does not preclude the auditory acquisition of language].
(b) "Deaf or hard of hearing" includes hearing impaired.
(5) "ICB" means the Interpreter Certification Board, created in Section 53A-26a-201.
