IMMUNIZATION OF STUDENTS AMENDMENTS

LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill amends provisions related to immunization requirements for students.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ defines terms;
- ▶ amends requirements for an exemption from required immunizations;
- ▶ requires the Department of Health to:
 - develop an immunization exemption form;
 - provide an immunization exemption form, free of charge, online and at local health departments;
 - develop an education module; and
 - make rules;
- ▶ requires an individual to receive educational information as a condition for receiving an immunization exemption form online;
- ▶ enacts renewal requirements for an exemption from required immunizations;
- ▶ requires a school to maintain a list of students who have not received required immunizations;
- ▶ amends provisions related to a conditional enrollment; and



26 ▶ makes technical and conforming changes.

45 Section 1. Section **26-1-17.5** is amended to read:

46 **26-1-17.5. Confidential records.**

47 (1) A record classified as confidential under this title shall remain confidential, and be
48 released according to the provisions of this title, notwithstanding Section **63G-2-310**.

49 (2) In addition to those persons granted access to [~~records~~] a private record described in
50 Subsection **63G-2-302(1)(b)**, immunization records may be shared among schools, school
51 districts, and local and state health departments and the state Department of Human Services as
52 necessary to [~~assure~~] ensure compliance with [~~Section 53A-11-301~~] Title 53A, Chapter 11, Part
53 3, Immunization of Students, and to prevent, investigate, and control the causes of epidemic,
54 infectious, communicable, and other diseases affecting the public health.

55 Section 2. Section **53A-11-300.5** is enacted to read:

56 **53A-11-300.5. Definitions.**

57 As used in this part:

58 (1) "Certificate of immunization" means:

59 (a) a certification stating that a student received each required immunization, including
60 the date each immunization was administered, issued by:

61 (i) a licensed health care provider;

62 (ii) an authorized representative of a local health department; or

63 (iii) an authorized representative of the department; or

64 (b) verification from the department, through a central database, that a student has
65 received each required immunization, including the date each immunization was administered.

66 (2) "Department" means the Department of Health, created in Section [26-1-4](#).

67 (3) "Immunization exemption form" means a form, described in Section [53A-11-302.5](#),
68 that exempts a student from one or more required immunizations.

69 (4) "Local education agency" or "LEA" means:

70 (a) a school district;

71 (b) a charter school; or

72 (c) the Utah Schools for the Deaf and the Blind.

73 (5) "Required immunizations" means immunizations against communicable diseases
74 required by department rule described in Section [53A-11-303](#).

75 (6) "School" means:

76 (a) a public school as defined in Section [26-39-102](#);

77 (b) center-based child care as defined in Section [26-39-102](#);

78 (c) residential child care, as defined in Section [26-39-102](#); or

79 (d) a private school that:

80 (i) is not primarily funded at public expense; and

81 (ii) provides education to students in any grade from kindergarten through grade 12.

82 (7) "Student" means an individual who attends a school.

83 Section 3. Section [53A-11-301](#) is repealed and reenacted to read:

84 **[53A-11-301](#). Certificate of immunization required -- Exceptions-- Weighted pupil**
85 **unit funding.**

86 (1) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (1)(b), a student may not attend a school
87 unless there is presented to the appropriate official of the school a certificate of immunization

88 for the student.

89 (b) A student who does not have a certificate of immunization may attend a school if
90 the student:

91 (i) is exempt as described in Section 53A-11-302;

92 (ii) qualifies for conditional enrollment under Section 53A-11-306; or

93 (iii) meets:

94 (A) the definition of a student under Section 53A-1-1001; and

95 (B) the immunization requirements for military children under Section 53A-1-1001.

96 (2) An LEA may not receive weighted pupil unit money for a student unless the
97 student:

98 (a) has a certificate of immunization; or

99 (b) is allowed to attend the LEA without a certificate of immunization as described in

100 Subsection (1)(b).

101 Section 4. Section 53A-11-302 is repealed and reenacted to read:

102 **53A-11-302. Exemption from required immunizations.**

103 A student is exempt from receiving required immunizations if the student's parent or
104 legal guardian presents to the appropriate official of the student's school:

105 (1) for an exemption for a medical reason:

106 (a) a certificate from a licensed healthcare provider stating that due to the physical
107 condition of the student, a required immunization would endanger the student's life or health;

108 and

109 (b) an immunization exemption form described in Section 53A-11-302.5; or

110 (2) for an exemption for a personal or religious belief, an immunization exemption
111 form described in Section 53A-11-302.5.

112 Section 5. Section 53A-11-302.5 is repealed and reenacted to read:

113 **53A-11-302.5. Immunization exemption form -- Online education module --**

114 **Renewal requirement.**

115 (1) The department shall:

116 (a) with input from local health departments, develop an immunization exemption
117 form that:

118 (i) specifies if an exemption is for a medical reason, a personal belief, or a religious

119 belief;
120 (ii) indicates that for a student to receive an exemption from required immunizations,
121 an individual described in Section (1)(a)(vi) shall:
122 (A) present an immunization exemption form the first time an exemption is sought;
123 and
124 (B) renew the student's exemption as described in Subsection (4) when the student
125 enters grade 7, and again when the student enters grade 10;
126 (iii) states the department's position regarding the benefits of immunization;
127 (iv) states policies for a student who has not received required immunizations, in the
128 event of an outbreak of a vaccine preventable illness;
129 (v) includes a statement claiming exemption from one or more required
130 immunizations, signed by:
131 (A) a student's parent or legal guardian;
132 (B) for a student who does not have a parent or legal guardian, the student's sibling of
133 legal age; or
134 (C) for a student 18 years of age or older, the student;
135 (vi) includes the name and address of the individual who signs the form;
136 (vii) includes the name of the student claiming exemption from one or more required
137 immunizations; and
138 (viii) includes the name of the school the student attends at the time the form is signed;
139 and
140 (b) make the immunization exemption form available to the public, free of charge:
141 (i) online, for an individual who completes the online education module described in
142 Subsection (2); and
143 (ii) in hard copy at local health departments.
144 (2) (a) The department shall develop an online education module that is intended to
145 take 20 minutes or less to complete and includes:
146 (i) information about vaccine preventable illnesses;
147 (ii) recommendations to reduce the likelihood of an unvaccinated individual
148 contracting or transmitting a vaccine preventable illness;
149 (iii) information, based on the best available science, about vaccine benefits and side

150 effects;

151 (iv) interactive questions or activities; and

152 (v) for an individual who completes the module, an immunization exemption form that
153 the individual can present to a school, as described in Subsection (3), to exempt each student
154 the individual intends to exempt from required immunizations.

155 (b) In developing the online education module, the department shall consult with
156 individuals interested in vaccination requirements, including individuals from organizations for
157 healthcare professionals.

158 (3) In order to exempt a student from required immunizations, a student's parent or
159 legal guardian shall present to the student's school an immunization exemption form, which the
160 parent or legal guardian can obtain by:

161 (a) completing the online education module described in Subsection (2); or

162 (b) going to a local health department in person.

163 (4) (a) A student's exemption from required immunizations is subject to the renewal
164 requirements described in Subsection (4)(b).

165 (b) In order to renew an exemption from required immunizations, when a student with
166 an exemption from required immunizations enters grade 7, and again when the student enters
167 grade 10, an individual described in Subsection (1)(a)(vi) shall present to the student's school
168 an immunization exemption form.

169 (c) An LEA may not charge a fee to renew an exemption from required immunizations.

170 (d) An exemption from required immunizations for a student who transfers to or
171 enrolls in a different school may, subject to the renewal requirements described in Subsection
172 (4)(b), be transferred to the student's new school if the student's previous school confirms that
173 the student has an exemption from required immunizations.

174 (5) For a student who has an immunization exemption for the 2016-2017 school year
175 or earlier, an individual described in Subsection (1)(a)(vi) is not required to obtain a new
176 immunization exemption form; and

177 (b) is subject to the renewal requirements described in Subsection (4)(b).

178 (6) Upon request of a local health department, a school shall provide a copy of a
179 student's immunization form to the local health department.

180 Section 6. Section **53A-11-303** is amended to read:

181 **53A-11-303. Department of Health regulations.**

182 (1) ~~[The Department of Health]~~ In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah
 183 Administrative Rulemaking Act, the department shall [adopt] make rules to establish:

184 (a) which immunizations are required [and] as a condition for attending school;

185 (b) the manner and frequency of [their] the administration[-] of required
 186 immunizations;

187 (c) the immunization exemption form described in Section 53A-11-302.5;

188 (d) the online education module described in Section 53A-11-302.5; and

189 (e) the requirements for a conditional enrollment described in Section 53A-11-306.

190 (2) The rules ~~[adopted]~~ made under Subsection (1) shall:

191 (a) conform to recognized standard medical practices[-]; and

192 ~~[(3) The rules shall]~~

193 (b) require [the reporting of] a school to report statistical information and names of
 194 ~~[noncompliers by the schools]~~ students who are not in compliance with Section 53A-11-301 to
 195 the department.

196 Section 7. Section **53A-11-304** is amended to read:

197 **53A-11-304. Certificate part of student's record -- Forms for certificates --**198 **Recording of immunization record as official certificate -- School record of noncertificate**
 199 **holders.**

200 (1) ~~[Each]~~ A school shall retain an official [certificates] certificate of immunization for
 201 ~~[every]~~ an enrolled student[-. The certificate becomes a] that is part of the ~~[individual]~~ student's
 202 permanent school record ~~[and follows the student through his or her public or private school~~
 203 ~~career].~~

204 (2) The ~~[Department of Health shall provide official certificate of immunization forms~~
 205 ~~to public and private]~~ department shall create an immunization form and distribute the
 206 immunization form to schools, [physicians] health care providers, and local health departments.
 207 ~~[The forms referred to in this subsection shall include a clear statement of the student's rights~~
 208 ~~under Section 53A-11-302.]~~

209 ~~[(3) Any immunization record provided by a licensed physician, registered nurse, or~~
 210 ~~public health official may be accepted by a school official as a certificate of immunization if~~
 211 ~~the type of immunization given and the dates given are specified and the]~~

212 (3) (a) A school shall record the information [is transferred to] on a certificate of
213 immunization as an official certificate of immunization [and verified by the school district in
214 which the public or private school is located].

215 (b) A school shall verify the information on a certificate of immunization.

216 (4) (a) At the beginning of each school year, a school shall create a list of students who
217 do not have an official certificate of immunization, noting if a student on the list is allowed to
218 attend school without a certificate of immunization, under Section [53A-11-301](#).

219 (b) A school shall provide the list of students described in Subsection (4)(a) to the
220 principal or other school director each year.

221 (c) A name appearing on the list described in Subsection (4)(a) is subject to
222 confidentiality requirements described in Section [26-1-17.5](#) and Section [53A-13-301](#).

223 Section 8. Section [53A-11-306](#) is repealed and reenacted to read:

224 **[53A-11-306. Conditional enrollment -- Suspension for noncompliance --](#)**
225 **Procedure.**

226 (1) (a) A student who has not received one or more required immunizations may attend
227 school on a conditional enrollment:

228 (i) if the student has received a dose of each required vaccine, but is not due for the
229 next dose of the vaccine under department rule described in Section [53A-11-303](#); or

230 (ii) except as provided in Subsection (1)(b), for up to 21 calendar days after the first
231 day of school.

232 (b) A student who enrolls in a school on or after the twenty-second calendar day after
233 the first day of school may attend school on a conditional enrollment for up to 21 calendar days
234 after the day on which the student enrolls in the school.

235 (2) (a) After the conditional enrollment period, a school shall prohibit further
236 attendance of a student who does not comply with Section [53A-11-301](#).

237 (b) After five days of a student's conditional enrollment, a school shall mail written
238 notice to the student's parent, legal guardian, or, if the student does not have a parent or legal
239 guardian, the student's legal age sibling that:

240 (i) the student will be suspended at the end of the conditional enrollment if the student
241 is not in compliance with Section [53A-11-301](#); and

242 (ii) describes the process for obtaining the required immunizations or an exemption

243 from the required immunizations.

244 Section 9. **Effective date.**

245 This bill takes effect on July 1, 2017.
