48 (3) If the election officer determines that the absentee voter is required to show valid

49 voter identification, the election officer shall:

- 50 (a) issue the voter a provisional ballot in accordance with Section [20A-3-105.5](#);
- 51 (b) instruct the voter to include a copy of the voter's valid voter identification with the
- 52 return ballot;
- 53 (c) provide the voter clear instructions on how to vote a provisional ballot; and
- 54 (d) comply with the requirements of Subsection (2).
