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29	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
30	Section 1. Section 53B-26-101 is enacted to read:
31	CHAPTER 26. STRATEGIC WORKFORCE INVESTMENT
32	<u>53B-26-101.</u> Title.
33	This chapter is known as "Strategic Workforce Investment."
34	Section 2. Section 53B-26-102 is enacted to read:
35	<u>53B-26-102.</u> Definitions.
36	As used in this chapter:
37	(1) "College of applied technology" means:
38	(a) a college described in Section 53B-2a-105;
39	(b) the School of Applied Technology at Salt Lake Community College established
40	under Section 53B-16-209;
41	(c) Utah State University Eastern established under Section 53B-18-1201; or
42	(d) the Snow College Richfield campus established under Section 53B-16-205.
43	(2) "CTE" means career and technical education.
44	(3) "CTE Region" means an economic service area created in Section 35A-2-101.
45	(4) "Eligible partnership" means a partnership:
46	(a) between at least two of the following:
47	(i) a college of applied technology;
48	(ii) a school district or charter school; or
49	(iii) an institution of higher education; and
50	(b) that provides educational services within the same CTE region.
51	(5) "Employer" means a private employer, public employer, industry association, the
52	military, or a union.
53	(6) "Industry advisory group" means:
54	(a) a group of at least five employers that represent the strategic industry cluster that a
55	proposal submitted under Section 53B-26-103 is responsive to; and
56	(b) a representative of the Governor's Office of Economic Development, appointed by
57	the executive director of the Governor's Office of Economic Development.
58	(7) "Institution of higher education" means the University of Utah, Utah State

59	University, Southern Utah University, Weber State University, Snow College, Dixie State		
60	University, Utah Valley University, and Salt Lake Community College.		
61	(8) "Stackable sequence of credentials" means a sequence of credentials that:		
62	(a) an individual can build upon to access an advanced job or higher wage;		
63	(b) is part of a career pathway system;		
64	(c) provides a pathway culminating in the equivalent of an associate's or bachelor's		
65	degree;		
66	(d) facilitates multiple exit and entry points; and		
67	(e) recognizes sub-goals or momentum points.		
68	Section 3. Section 53B-26-103 is enacted to read:		
69	53B-26-103. GOED reporting requirement Proposals Funding.		
70	(1) The Governor's Office of Economic Development shall publish, on a biannual		
71	basis, a report detailing the high demand technical jobs projected to support economic growth		
72	in high need strategic industry clusters, including:		
73	(a) aerospace and defense;		
74	(b) energy and natural resources;		
75	(c) financial services;		
76	(d) life sciences;		
77	(e) outdoor products;		
78	(f) software development and information technology; or		
79	(g) any other strategic industry cluster designated by the Governor's Office of		
80	Economic Development.		
81	(2) To receive funding under this section, an eligible partnership shall submit a		
82	proposal containing the elements described in Subsection (3) to the Legislature:		
83	(a) on or before July 1, 2016, for fiscal year 2017; or		
84	(b) on or before January 5 for fiscal year 2018 and any succeeding fiscal year.		
85	(3) The proposal shall include:		
86	(a) a program of study that:		
87	(i) is responsive to the workforce needs of the CTE region in a high need strategic		
88	industry cluster as identified by the Governor's Office of Economic Development under		
89	Subsection (1);		

90	(ii) leads to the attainment of a stackable sequence of credentials; and
91	(iii) includes a non-duplicative progression of courses that include both academic and
92	CTE content;
93	(b) expected student enrollment, attainment rates, and job placement rates;
94	(c) evidence of input and support for the proposal from an industry advisory group;
95	(d) evidence of an official action in support of the proposal from:
96	(i) the Utah College of Applied Technology Board of Trustees, if the eligible
97	partnership includes a college described in Section 53B-2a-105; or
98	(ii) the Board of Regents, if the eligible partnership includes:
99	(A) an institution of higher education; or
100	(B) a college described in Subsection 53B-26-102(1)(b), (c), or (d); and
101	(e) a funding request, including justification for the request.
102	(4) The Legislature shall:
103	(a) review a proposal submitted under this section using the following criteria:
104	(i) the proposal contains the elements described in Subsection (3);
105	(ii) support for the proposal is widespread within the CTE region; and
106	(iii) the proposal expands the capacity to meet regional workforce needs; and
107	(b) determine the extent to which to fund the proposal.
108	Section 4. Appropriation.
109	Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures Act, for
110	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017, the following sums of money
111	are appropriated from resources not otherwise appropriated, or reduced from amounts
112	previously appropriated, out of the funds or amounts indicated. These sums of money are in
113	addition to amounts previously appropriated for fiscal year 2017.
