57 circular in design, located in the center of the intersection where traffic passes to the right of
58 the island.

191 persons have any right or easement, or have only a limited right or easement of access, light,

194 body of a county, municipal, or other local board or body having authority to enact laws
195 relating to traffic under the constitution and laws of the state.

196 [~~29~~] (32) (a) "Low-speed vehicle" means a four wheeled electric motor vehicle that:

197 (i) is designed to be operated at speeds of not more than 25 miles per hour; and

198 (ii) has a capacity of not more than four passengers, including the driver.

344 inconsistent with this chapter placed or erected by a highway authority for the purpose of
345 regulating, warning, or guiding traffic.

347 mechanically operated, by which traffic is alternately directed to stop and permitted to proceed.

349 designed, intended, or used to interfere with the operation or cycle of a traffic-control signal.

383 be transported or drawn on a highway, except devices used exclusively on stationary rails or
384 tracks.

385 Section 2. Section 41-6a-1115.5 is enacted to read:

386 **41-6a-1115.5. Electric assisted bicycles -- Restrictions -- Penalties.**

387 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, an electric assisted bicycle is subject
388 to the provisions under this chapter for a bicycle.

389 (2) An individual may operate an electric assisted bicycle on a path or trail designated
390 for the use of a bicycle.

391 (3) A local authority or state agency may adopt an ordinance or rule to regulate or
392 restrict the use of an electric assisted bicycle, or a specific classification of an electric assisted
393 bicycle, on a sidewalk, path, or trail within the jurisdiction of the local authority or state
394 agency.

395 (4) An individual under 16 years of age may not operate a class 3 electric assisted
396 bicycle.

397 (5) An individual under 14 years of age may not operate an electric assisted bicycle

398 with the electric motor engaged on any public property, highway, path, or sidewalk unless the
399 individual is under the direct supervision of the individual's parent or guardian.

400 (6) An individual under eight years of age may not operate an electric assisted bicycle
401 with the electric motor engaged on any public property, highway, path, or sidewalk.

402 (7) The owner of an electric assisted bicycle may not authorize or knowingly permit an
403 individual to operate an electric assisted bicycle in violation of this section.

404 (8) (a) Beginning January 1, 2017, each Utah-based manufacturer of an electric assisted
