	Section 1. Section <b>53A-15-2001</b> is enacted to read:
	Part 20. Kindergarten Supplemental Enrichment Program
	<u>53A-15-2001.</u> Title.
	This part is known as "Kindergarten Supplemental Enrichment Program."
	Section 2. Section <b>53A-15-2002</b> is enacted to read:
	53A-15-2002. Definitions.
	As used in this part:
	(1) "Board" means the State Board of Education.
	(2) "Kindergarten supplemental enrichment program" means a program to improve the
<u>aca</u>	demic competency of kindergarten students that:
	(a) meets the criteria described in Section 53A-15-2003;
	(b) receives funding from a grant program described in Section 53A-15-2003; and
	(c) is administered by a public school.

	(1) (a) In accordance with this section, the board shall distribute funds appropriated
<u>unc</u>	ler this section to support kindergarten supplemental enrichment programs.
	(b) The board may use up to 1% of the funds described in Subsection (1)(a) for the
<u>adr</u>	ninistrative cost of running the grant programs described in Subsection (2).
	(c) The board shall develop kindergarten entry and exit assessments for use by a
<u>kin</u>	dergarten supplemental enrichment program.
	(2) The board shall administer a qualifying grant program as described in this
Sul	osection (2) to distribute funds described in Subsection (1)(a) to a public school:
	(a) that applies for a grant;
	(b) that offers a kindergarten supplemental enrichment program that meets the
req	uirements described in Subsection (3);
	(c) where 50% of students were eligible to receive free or reduced lunch in the prior

59	school year;
60	(d) that has an overall need for a kindergarten supplemental enrichment program, based
61	on the results of the public school's kindergarten entry and exit assessments described in
62	Subsection (3)(b)(ii);
63	(e) if the school has previously established a kindergarten supplemental enrichment
64	program under this section, that shows success of the public school's kindergarten
65	supplemental enrichment program, based on the results of the public school's kindergarten
66	entry and exit assessments described in Subsection (3)(b)(ii); and
67	(f) that proposes a kindergarten supplemental enrichment program that addresses the
68	particular needs of students at risk of experiencing intergenerational poverty, as defined in
69	Section 35A-9-102, using eligibility for free or reduced lunch as a primary indicator.
70	(3) A public school that receives a grant as described in Subsection (2) shall:
71	(a) use the grant money to offer a kindergarten supplemental enrichment program that:
72	(i) target kindergarten students at risk for not meeting grade 3 core standards for Utah
73	public schools, established by the board under Section 53A-1-402.6, by the end of each
74	student's grade 3 year;
75	(ii) use an evidence-based early intervention model;
76	(iii) focus on academically improving age-appropriate literacy and numeracy skills;
77	(iv) emphasize the use of live instruction;
78	(v) administer the kindergarten entry and exit assessments described in Subsection
79	(1)(c); and
80	(vi) deliver the kindergarten supplemental enrichment program through additional
81	hours or other means; and
82	(b) report to the board annually regarding:
83	(i) how the public school used grant money received under Subsection (2);
84	(ii) the results of the public school's kindergarten entry and exit assessments for the
85	prior year;
86	(iii) with assistance from board employees, the number of students served, including
87	the number of students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch; and
88	(iv) with assistance from board employees, student performance outcomes achieved by
89	the public school's kindergarten supplemental enrichment program, disaggregated by economic

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90	and ethnic subgroups.
91	(4) A public school that receives a grant as described in Subsection (2) may not receive
92	funds appropriated under Section 53A-17a-167.
93	(5) A parent or legal guardian may decline participation of the parent or legal
94	guardian's kindergarten student in a public school's kindergarten supplemental enrichment
95	program.
96	(6) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the
97	board shall make rules to establish reporting procedures and administer this section.

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
