Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 53A-1a-525 is enacted to read:
53A-1a-525. Utah Charter School Profile Website.
(1) As used in this section:
(a) "Charter management organization" means a person with which a charter school
contracts to provide management or oversight services regarding the charter school's
expenditures, administration, personnel, or instructional materials or methods.
(b) "Website" means the Utah Charter School Profile Website described in Subsection
<u>(2).</u>
(2) There is created the Utah Charter School Profile Website to be administered by the
State Board of Education.
(3) The website shall permit an individual to review or access the following profile
information for each charter school:
(a) the charter school's charter school application described in Section 53A-1a-504;
(b) the charter school's charter agreement described in Section 53A-1a-508;
(c) (i) the number of teachers employed by the charter school who are licensed; and
(ii) the number of teachers employed by the charter school on the basis of
demonstrated competency, qualified to teach under alternative certification or authorization
programs;
(d) whether the charter school has elected in accordance with Section 53A-1a-512 to
participate as an employer for the following retirement programs:
(i) Title 49, Chapter 12, Public Employees' Contributory Retirement Act;
(ii) Title 49, Chapter 13, Public Employees' Noncontributory Retirement Act; or
(iii) Title 49, Chapter 22, New Public Employees' Tier II Contributory Retirement Act;
(e) (i) whether under Section 53A-1a-512 the governing board of the charter has
offered employee benefit plans for the charter school employees under Title 49, Chapter 20,

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59	Public Employees' Benefit and Insurance Program Act or under any other program; and
60	(ii) if the governing board offers employee benefits in a program that is not described
61	in Title 49, Chapter 20, Public Employees' Benefit and Insurance Program Act, a statement that
62	the charter school as an employer does not offer those benefits;
63	(f) if the charter school receives a school grade under Chapter 1, Part 11, School
64	Grading Act, the charter school's grade and a link to school grading information on the State
65	Board of Education website;
66	(g) the number of students in the last five years or, if the charter has been open for
67	enrollment for fewer than five years, since the charter school opened for enrollment, who
68	transferred to another public or private school after attending the charter school for:
69	(i) less than one year;
70	(ii) one year;
71	(iii) two years; and
72	(iv) three years;
73	(h) (i) the charter school's mission statement; and
74	(ii) specific information on how the charter school implements the mission statement
75	and accomplishes mission statement objectives;
76	(i) (i) the name of a charter management organization, if any, that the charter school
77	contracts with and a reasonable description of the services that the charter management
78	organization provides; and
79	(ii) the percent of the charter school's annual budget that is paid to the charter
80	management organization;
81	(j) (i) each time, if at all, the charter school's governing board has requested the charter
82	school's authorizer to place the charter school in a voluntary school improvement process
83	described in Section 53A-1a-509.5; and
84	(ii) if the charter school's governing board has made a request described in Subsection
85	(3)(j)(i), each year in which the governing board made the request and each time that the
86	charter school's authorizer granted the request;
87	(k) a link to the Utah Public Finance Website created in Section 63A-3-402 with an
88	explanation that information on charter school expenditures is available on the Utah Public

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90	(1) a copy of the charter school's most recent financial audit report as described in
91	Section 53A-1a-507; and
92	(m) whether the charter school requires a student's parent or guardian to volunteer time
93	in the classroom or otherwise for the parent or guardian's student to attend the charter school.
94	(4) No later than January 1, 2018, the website shall:
95	(a) be operational; and
96	(b) permit public access to the information described in Subsection (3).
97	(5) The State Board of Education shall maintain an archive of all information on the
98	website.
99	(6) Upon request by the State Board of Education, a charter school authorizer or charter
100	school shall provide or assist with the collection of information described in Subsection (3).
101	(7) (a) A charter school shall include on an enrollment application to the charter school
102	the following statement in easy-to-read font type and size: "The State Board of Education
103	provides profile information about this and other charter schools on the Utah Charter School
104	Profile Website, including information about teachers employed by a charter school, charter
105	school expenditures, charter school agreements, and charter school student transfer rates to
106	other schools."
107	(b) If the enrollment application is an electronic application, the charter school shall
108	include a hyperlink to the charter school's profile on the website.
