9	This bill authorizes a Support the 2nd Amendment and $\hat{S} \rightarrow [New] \leftarrow \hat{S}$ State-Owned

35	Section 1. Section 23-14-13.5 is enacted to read:

37	(1) There is created in the General Fund a restricted account known as the "Support for
38	Ŝ→ [<u>New</u>] ←Ŝ State-Owned Shooting Ranges Restricted Account."
39	(2) The account shall be funded by:
40	(a) contributions deposited into the account in accordance with Section 41-1a-422;
41	(b) private contributions; and
42	(c) donations or grants from public or private entities.
43	(3) Upon appropriation by the Legislature, the division shall distribute funds in the
44	account to facilitate construction of new $\hat{S} \rightarrow [\underline{outdoor}] \leftarrow \hat{S}$ firearm shooting ranges $\hat{S} \rightarrow \underline{, and}$

57	(a) (i) Except as provided in Subsection (1)(a)(ii), "contributor" means a person who
58	has donated or in whose name at least \$25 has been donated to:

59	(A) a scholastic scholarship fund of a single named institution;
60	(B) the Department of Veterans' and Military Affairs for veterans' programs;
61	(C) the Division of Wildlife Resources for the Wildlife Resources Account created in
62	Section 23-14-13, for conservation of wildlife and the enhancement, preservation, protection,
63	access, and management of wildlife habitat;
64	(D) the Department of Agriculture and Food for the benefit of conservation districts;
65	(E) the Division of Parks and Recreation for the benefit of snowmobile programs;
66	(F) the Guardian Ad Litem Services Account and the Children's Museum of Utah, with
67	the donation evenly divided between the two;
68	(G) the Boy Scouts of America for the benefit of a Utah Boy Scouts of America
69	council as specified by the contributor;
70	(H) No More Homeless Pets in Utah for distribution to organizations or individuals
71	that provide spay and neuter programs that subsidize the sterilization of domestic animals;
72	(I) the Utah Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs, Inc. to provide and enhance youth
73	development programs;
74	(J) the Utah Association of Public School Foundations to support public education;

113	(ii) (A) For a veterans' special group license plate, "contributor" means a person who
114	has donated or in whose name at least a \$25 donation at the time of application and \$10 annual
115	donation thereafter has been made.
116	(B) For a Utah Housing Opportunity special group license plate, "contributor" means a
117	person who:
118	(I) has donated or in whose name at least \$30 has been donated at the time of
119	application and annually after the time of application; and
120	(II) is a member of a trade organization for real estate licensees that has more than

121 15,000 Utah members.

(C) For an Honoring Heroes special group license plate, "contributor" means a person
who has donated or in whose name at least \$35 has been donated at the time of application and
annually thereafter.

(D) For a firefighter support special group license plate, "contributor" means a personwho:

(I) has donated or in whose name at least \$15 has been donated at the time ofapplication and annually after the time of application; and

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(II) is a currently employed, volunteer, or retired firefighter.

(E) For a cancer research special group license plate, "contributor" means a person who
has donated or in whose name at least \$35 has been donated at the time of application and
annually after the time of application.

(F) For a Martin Luther King, Jr. Civil Rights Support special group license plate,
"contributor" means a person who has donated or in whose name at least \$35 has been donated
at the time of application and annually thereafter.

(G) For a Utah Law Enforcement Memorial Support special group license plate,
"contributor" means a person who has donated or in whose name at least \$35 has been donated
at the time of application and annually thereafter.

(b) "Institution" means a state institution of higher education as defined under Section
53B-3-102 or a private institution of higher education in the state accredited by a regional or
national accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education.

(2) (a) An applicant for original or renewal collegiate special group license plates under
Subsection (1)(a)(i) must be a contributor to the institution named in the application and
present the original contribution verification form under Subsection (2)(b) or make a

145 contribution to the division at the time of application under Subsection (3).

(b) An institution with a support special group license plate shall issue to a contributora verification form designed by the commission containing:

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(i) the name of the contributor;

- 149 (ii) the institution to which a donation was made;
- 150 (iii) the date of the donation; and
- 151 (iv) an attestation that the donation was for a scholastic scholarship.

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152	(c) The state auditor may audit each institution to verify that the money collected by the
153	institutions from contributors is used for scholastic scholarships.
154	(d) After an applicant has been issued collegiate license plates or renewal decals, the
155	commission shall charge the institution whose plate was issued, a fee determined in accordance
156	with Section 63J-1-504 for management and administrative expenses incurred in issuing and
157	renewing the collegiate license plates.
158	(e) If the contribution is made at the time of application, the contribution shall be
159	collected, treated, and deposited as provided under Subsection (3).
160	(3) (a) An applicant for original or renewal support special group license plates under
161	this section must be a contributor to the sponsoring organization associated with the license
162	plate.
163	(b) This contribution shall be:
164	(i) unless collected by the named institution under Subsection (2), collected by the
165	division;
166	(ii) considered a voluntary contribution for the funding of the activities specified under
167	this section and not a motor vehicle registration fee;
168	(iii) deposited into the appropriate account less actual administrative costs associated
169	with issuing the license plates; and
170	(iv) for a firefighter special group license plate, deposited into the appropriate account
171	less:
172	(A) the costs of reordering firefighter special group license plate decals; and
173	(B) the costs of replacing recognition special group license plates with new license
174	plates under Subsection 41-1a-1211(13).
175	(c) The donation described in Subsection (1)(a) must be made in the 12 months prior to
176	registration or renewal of registration.
177	(d) The donation described in Subsection (1)(a) shall be a one-time donation made to
178	the division when issuing original:
179	(i) snowmobile license plates; or
180	(ii) conservation license plates.
181	(4) Veterans' license plates shall display one of the symbols representing the Army,
182	Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, or American Legion.
