	Section 1. Section 20A-1-502 is amended to read:
	20A-1-502. Midterm vacancy in office of United States senator.
	[(1) When a vacancy occurs for any reason in the office of a representative in
Congr	ress, the governor shall issue a proclamation calling an election to fill the vacancy.]
	$[\frac{(2)(a)}{2}]$ When a vacancy occurs in the office of $[\frac{U.S.}{2}]$ United States senator, $[\frac{it}{2}]$
the va	cancy shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next regular general election.
	[(b)] (2) The governor shall appoint [a person] an individual to serve as [U.S.] United
States	senator until the vacancy is filled by election from one of three [persons] individuals
nomin	nated by the state central committee of the same political party as the prior officeholder.
	Section 2. Section 20A-1-502.5 is enacted to read:
	20A-1-502.5. Midterm vacancy in office of United States representative.
	(1) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (2), when a vacancy occurs in the office of
United	d States representative, the governor shall, within seven days after the day on which the
vacan	cy occurs:
	(i) issue a proclamation calling a special congressional election to fill the vacancy; and
	(ii) post the proclamation on the lieutenant governor's website.
	(b) An individual who fills a vacancy under this section shall serve until the end of the
curren	nt term for which the vacancy exists.
	(2) If the vacancy occurs on or after the date of the regular general election, and before
the be	ginning of the term for the office of United States representative:
	(a) the governor may not call a special congressional election to fill the vacancy; and
	(b) the office shall remain vacant for the remainder of the current term.
	(3) If the vacancy occurs 90 or fewer days before the day of the next regular general
electio	on.

58	of the special congressional election on the same date as the regular general election; and
59	(b) the same candidate who wins the election for the term beginning on January 1 shall

62	(4) If the vacancy occurs on or after the day of the regular primary election and more
63	than 90 days before the next regular general election:
64	(a) the governor shall, in the proclamation described in Subsection (1)(a), set the date
65	of the special congressional election no sooner than 90 days after the date of the vacancy and
66	no later than the date of the regular general election;
67	(b) (i) a candidate who qualifies for placement on the regular general election ballot for
68	the office of United States representative shall appear as a candidate on the special
69	congressional election ballot if the candidate files a declaration of candidacy to fill the vacancy
70	within the later of three days after:
71	(A) the day on which the governor issues the proclamation described in Subsection
72	(1)(a); or
73	(B) the day of the canvass for the regular primary election;
74	(ii) if a candidate described in Subsection (4)(b)(i) fails to timely file a declaration of
75	candidacy to fill the vacancy, the candidate shall be replaced on the special congressional
76	election ballot using the candidate vacancy procedures described in this part, within deadlines
77	established by the governor in the proclamation described in Subsection (1)(a); and
78	(c) the candidate who wins the special congressional election shall fill the vacancy for
79	the remainder of the current term.
80	(5) If the vacancy occurs before the date of the regular primary election, and after the
81	beginning of a term for the office of United States representative the governor shall, in the
82	proclamation described in Subsection (1)(a):
83	(a) set the date of the special congressional election to fill the vacancy no sooner than
84	90 days after the date of the vacancy and no later than 110 days after the date of the vacancy;
85	(b) state that the winner of the election:
86	(i) will be determined in a single election, without a primary election; and
87	(ii) will fill the vacancy for the remainder of the current term;

88	(c) permit each registered political party at least seven days to select one candidate, in a
89	manner determined by the registered political party, as the candidate for the registered political
90	party;
91	(d) establish the deadlines, time frames, and procedures for filing a declaration of
92	candidacy for an affiliated candidate, filing a certificate of nomination and gathering signatures
93	for an unaffiliated candidate, filing a declaration of candidacy for a write-in candidate, giving
94	notice of an election, and other election requirements; and
95	(e) require an election officer to send ballots to military and overseas voters no later
96	than 45 days before the date of the special congressional election.
97	(6) If, for any reason, a candidate vacancy occurs in a special congressional election at
98	least one day before the day on which the lieutenant governor certifies the names to be included
99	on the special congressional election ballot, the registered political party of the candidate shall
100	certify a replacement candidate to the lieutenant governor before a deadline established by the
101	lieutenant governor.
102	Section 3. Effective date.
103	If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, this bill takes effect
104	upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of Utah
105	Constitution, Article VII, Section 8, without the governor's signature, or in the case of a veto,
106	the date of veto override.
