This chapter is known as the ["State Certification of Music Therapists Act."] "Music
Therapists Licensing Act."

In addition to the definitions in Section 58-1-102, as used in this chapter:
(1) "Practice of music therapy" means the clinical and evidence-based use of music
interventions to accomplish individualized goals within a therapeutic relationship.
(2) "State [certification] licensure" means a designation granted by the division on
behalf of the state to an individual who has met the requirements for state [certification]
licensure related to an occupation or profession described in this chapter.
(3) "State [certified] licensed" means, when used in conjunction with an occupation or

(a) may be used by a person who has met the state [certification] licensure

(1) The division shall grant state [certification] licensure to a person who qualifies
