	Section 1. Section 11-63-101 is enacted to read:		
	11-63-101. Review of open investigation.		
	(1) A review of an investigation may be requested at least one year after the date of the		



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28	incident that initiated the original investigation if the investigating agency has made no		
29	significant progress in solving the case:		
30	(a) by the victim of a first degree violent felony;		
31	(b) by the family member of the victim of a homicide; or		
32	(c) by the family member of a missing person.		
33	(2) A victim or victim's family may request review of an open investigation:		
34	(a) first, by the chief executive of the law enforcement agency conducting the		
35	investigation;		
36	(b) second, by the county or district attorney in the jurisdiction in which the crime		
37	occurred or the person went missing; and		
38	(c) finally, by the Office of the Attorney General.		
39	(3) Each entity in Subsection (2) shall have up to 30 days to review an open		
40	investigation request. The entity shall communicate a decision in writing to the victim or
