Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 18-1-1 is amended to read:
18-1-1. Liability and damages for dog injury Dogs used in law enforcement.
[(1) Every person owning or keeping a dog is liable in damages for injury committed
by the dog, and it is not necessary in the action brought therefor to allege or prove that the dog
was of a vicious or mischievous disposition or that the owner or keeper of the dog knew that it
was vicious or mischievous.]

30 (1) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (2), a person who owns or keeps a dog is 31 liable for an injury caused by the dog, regardless of whether: 32 (i) the dog is vicious or mischievous; or (ii) the owner knows the dog is vicious or mischievous. 33 34 (b) Damages for an injury described in Subsection (1)(a) shall be determined in 35 accordance with Section 78B-5-818. 36 (2) [Notwithstanding Subsection (1), neither] Neither the state nor any county, city, 37 metro township, or town in the state nor any peace officer employed by [any of them] the state, a county, a city, a metro township, or a town shall be liable in damages for an injury 38 39 [committed] caused by a dog, if: 40 (a) the dog has been trained to assist in law enforcement; and 41 (b) the injury occurs while the dog is reasonably and carefully being used in the 42 apprehension, arrest, or location of a suspected offender or in maintaining or controlling the 43 public order.
