28	(1) Upon request by a member of the Legislature, a Criminal Code Changes Impact
29	Statement shall be prepared by the commission with respect to certain bills and amendments
30	that could, if passed, increase or decrease the number of criminal convictions or the inmate
31	population of juvenile detention facilities or correctional facilities in this state.
32	(2) When a request is made pursuant to Subsection (1), the commission shall prepare a
33	Criminal Code Changes Impact Statement:
34	(a) within two business days of receipt if the request is made while the Legislature is in
35	session; or
36	(b) within 10 business days of receipt if the request is made while the Legislature is not
37	in session.
38	(3) The Criminal Code Changes Impact Statement shall include:
39	(a) the estimated number of criminal cases or juvenile court adjudications per year that
40	the legislation may affect; and
41	(b) an estimate of how the proposed legislation would change the following
42	demographics of the criminal offender or juvenile detention population:
43	(i) race;
44	(ii) ethnicity;
45	(iii) sex;
46	(iv) age;
47	(v) sexual orientation;
48	(vi) gender identity; and
49	(vii) disability.
50	(4) If the commission does not have ready access to the demographic information
51	required for the report, the commission shall indicate on the report:
52	(a) which demographic population lacks sufficient data; and
53	(b) why the commission does not have access to sufficient data regarding that
54	demographic population.
55	(5) The Criminal Code Changes Impact Statement is not a public document and may
56	only be provided to the legislator who requested it.

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
