284	who has donated or in whose name at least \$35 has been donated at the time of application and

289	application and annually after the time of application; and
290	(II) is a currently employed, volunteer, or retired firefighter.
291	(E) For a cancer research special group license plate, "contributor" means a person who
292	has donated or in whose name at least \$35 has been donated at the time of application and
293	annually after the time of application.
294	(F) For a Utah Law Enforcement Memorial Support special group license plate,
295	"contributor" means a person who has donated or in whose name at least \$35 has been donated
296	at the time of application and annually thereafter.
297	(b) "Institution" means a state institution of higher education as defined under Section
298	53B-3-102 or a private institution of higher education in the state accredited by a regional or
299	national accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education.
300	(2) (a) An applicant for original or renewal collegiate special group license plates under
301	Subsection (1)(a)(i) must be a contributor to the institution named in the application and
302	present the original contribution verification form under Subsection (2)(b) or make a
303	contribution to the division at the time of application under Subsection (3).
304	(b) An institution with a support special group license plate shall issue to a contributor
305	a verification form designed by the commission containing:

306	(i) the name of the contributor;
307	(ii) the institution to which a donation was made;
308	(iii) the date of the donation; and
309	(iv) an attestation that the donation was for a scholastic scholarship.
310	(c) The state auditor may audit each institution to verify that the money collected by the
311	institutions from contributors is used for scholastic scholarships.
312	(d) After an applicant has been issued collegiate license plates or renewal decals, the
313	commission shall charge the institution whose plate was issued, a fee determined in accordance
314	with Section 63J-1-504 for management and administrative expenses incurred in issuing and
315	renewing the collegiate license plates.
316	(e) If the contribution is made at the time of application, the contribution shall be
317	collected, treated, and deposited as provided under Subsection (3).
318	(3) (a) An applicant for original or renewal support special group license plates under
319	this section must be a contributor to the sponsoring organization associated with the license
320	plate.
321	(b) This contribution shall be:
322	(i) unless collected by the named institution under Subsection (2), collected by the
323	division;
324	(ii) considered a voluntary contribution for the funding of the activities specified under
325	this section and not a motor vehicle registration fee;
326	(iii) deposited into the appropriate account less actual administrative costs associated
327	with issuing the license plates; and
328	(iv) for a firefighter special group license plate, deposited into the appropriate account
329	less:
330	(A) the costs of reordering firefighter special group license plate decals; and
