11	General Description:
12	This bill creates the Mental Health Crisis Intervention Council to establish protocols
13	and standards for the training and functioning of local mental health crisis intervention
14	teams.
15	Highlighted Provisions:
16	This bill:
17	 defines terms;
18	 creates the Mental Health Crisis Intervention Council;
19	 addresses the council's membership, meetings, compensation, and staff;
20	 describes the duties of the council, including developing a program providing for:
21	• training, and developing protocols and standards, for local mental health crisis
22	intervention teams; and
23	• implementation and oversight of crisis intervention teams on a local and
24	statewide basis;
25	 requires the council to present the program and recommendations relating to the
26	program to the Government Operations Interim Committee and other organizations;
27	 provides for training grants as funding becomes available; and

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28	 repeals the council after the council's duties are completed.

106	(b) establish standards for completion of initial crisis intervention team training and
107	annual continuing education training, including:
