	Section 1. Section 31A-22-649.5 is amended to read:

	(1) As used in this section:
	(a) "Mental health condition" means the same as that term is defined in Section

33	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 31A-22-618.5, a health benefit plan
34	offered in the individual market, the small group market, or the large group market [and
35	entered into or renewed on or after January 1, 2021,] shall:
36	(a) provide coverage for telemedicine services that are covered by Medicare; [and]
37	(b) reimburse, at a commercially reasonable rate, a network provider that provides the
