- 1. Page 4, Lines 109 through 110:
 - 109 (a) {-designate the geographic areas within the county in which large concentrated animal
 - 110
 feeding operations may be located, including adopting a map described in Section

 17-27a-1104
 designate geographic areas of sufficient size to support large concentrated animal

 feeding operations, including state trust lands described in Subsection 53C-1-103(8) and private

 property within the county, including adopting a map described in Section 17-27a-1104
- 2. Page 4, Lines 119 through 120:
 - 119 (3) (a) This part does not authorize a county to regulate the operation of large concentrated
 - 120 animal feeding operations in any way that conflicts with state or federal statutes or regulations.
 <u>(b) Nothing in this part supersedes or authorizes enactment of an ordinance that infringes on</u> <u>Chapter 41, Agriculture, Industrial, or Critical Infrastructure Materials Protection Areas, or Title 4,</u> <u>Chapter 44, Agricultural Operations Nuisances Act.</u>
- 3. Page 5, Lines 137 through 140:
 - 137 (iii) topography; and
 - 138 (iv) economic benefits to the county {; and
 - 139 <u>(v) access to transportation, water, and power infrastructure</u>} .
 - 140 (b) A county may consider criteria in addition to those described in Subsection (1)(a).

<u>(c) A designated geographic area shall have economically accessible transportation, electrical</u> <u>infrastructure, and water supply, whether by groundwater or other means, sufficient to support large</u> <u>concentrated animal feeding operations.</u>

- 4. Page 5, Line 149 through Page 6, Line 159:
 - 149 {<u>(4) If the county establishes different geographic areas for large concentrated animal</u>
 - 150 <u>feeding operations based on animal species type, the county shall provide the rationale as to how</u>
 - 151 <u>the establishment of different geographic areas based on animal species type promotes the</u>
 - 152 general welfare and best interests of county residents.}
 - 153 {(5)} (4) A county shall designate at least one geographic area within the county where large
 - 154 <u>concentrated animal feeding operations</u> {<u>for any animal species listed in Subsection</u>
 - 155 <u>17-27a-1102(6)</u> may be located unless the county demonstrates that one of the following makes it

- 156 {<u>impossible</u>} <u>not feasible</u> for the county to meet the criteria described in this section:
- 157 (a) the county's population density; or
- 158 (b) the county's population density relative to the amount of private land within the
