- (a) the registration nttmber assigned to the vehiele for which it is isstred,
(b) the name of the state; and
(c) unless exempted by Section 41-1a-301 or 41-1a-407, a registration deeal showing the date of expiration displayed in aceordance with Subsection (6).
- (2) If registration is extended by affixing a registration deeal to the lieense plate, the expiration date of the deeal governs the expiration date of the lieense plate.
(3) Exeept as provided in Subseetion (4), each original lieense plate that is not one of the special group lieense plates issued under Seetion 41-1a-418 shall be:
- (a) a statehod eentennial lieense plate with the same color, design, and slogan as the plates issted in conjunetion with the statehood centenniat,

(c) an In God We Trust license plate[.]: or
(d) a lieense plate that refleets the state flag of Utah deseribed in Seetion 636-1-501.
(4) Beginning on the date that the division determines the existing inventories of

statehoodeentennial lieense plates and Ski Utah lieense plates are exhausted, each lieense plate that is not one of the special group lieense plates issted under Seetion 41-1a-418 shatt:
(a) (i) display the "Life Elevated" slogan; and
(ii) have a color and design approved by the 57 th Legistature in the 2007 General Session that features.

- (A) a skier with the "Greatest Strow on Earth" slogan; or
- (B) Delieate Areh;
(b) be an In God We Trust lieense plate;
- (e) be a lieense plate that refleets the state flag of Utah deseribed in Seetion

636-1-501; or

- [(e)] (d) beginning on the date that the division determines the existing inventories of deeals for an apportioned vehiele deseribed in Seetion 41-1a-301 are exhausted, be a distinetive tieense plate displaying the word "apportioned" or the abbreviation "APP."
- (5) (a) Exeept as provided under Subsection 41-1a-215(2) and Seetion 41-1a-216, tieense plates shall be renewed anntually.
- (b) (i) The division shall issue the vehiele owner a month deeal and a year deeal upon the vehicle's first registration with the division.
(ii) The division shall issue the vehiele owner only a year deeal upon subsequent renewals of registration to validate registration renewal.
(6) The deeals issued in aceordance with Subsection (5) shall be applied as follows:
(a) for lieense plates issued beginning in 1974 through 1985, deeals displayecton tieense plates with black lettering on a white baekground shall be applied to the lower left-hand eorner of the rear of the lieense plate vehieles,
- (b) deeals displayed on statehood eentennial lieense plates and on Ski Utah lieense plates isstred in aceordance with Subseetion (3) shall be applied to the upper left-hand eomer of the rear lieense plate,
(c) deeals displayed on special group lieense plates isstred in accordance with Seetion 41-1a-418 shall be applied to the upper right-hand comner of the lieense plate unless there is a plate indentation on the upper left-hand comer of the lieense plate;
(d) deeals displayed on lieense plates with the "Life Elevated" slogan issted in aceordance with Subsection (4) shall be applied in the upper left-hand comner for the month

- (e) deeals displayed on lieense plates with the "InGod We Trust" slogan issted in accordanee with Subsection (4)(b) shall be applied in the upper right-hand comer of the rear lieense plate unless there is a plate indentation on the upper left-hand corner of the lieense plate,
- (f) deeals displayed on lieense plates refleeting the state flag of Utah isstred in accordance with Subseetion (4) shall be applied in the upper left-hand comner for the month deeal and the upper right-hand eorner for the year deeat;
- [(f)] (g) deeals issued for motoreycles shall be applied to the upper comer of the license plate opposite the word "Utah", and
[ [(g)] (h) deeals displayed on lieense plates issued under Seetion 41-1a-416 shall be applied as appropriate for the year of the plate.
(7) (a) The month deeal issued in aceordance with Subseetion (5) shall be displayed on the lieense plate in the left position.
(b) The year deeal isstred in aceordance with Subseetion (5) shall be displayed on the tieense plate in the right position.
- (8) The e urrent year deeal issued in aceordance with Subseetion (5) shall be placed over or in place of the previous year deeal.
(9) If a lieense plate, month deeal, or year deeal is lost or destroyed, a replacement shalt be isstred upon applieation and payment of the fees required under Seetion 41-1a-1211 or 41-1a-1212.
- (10) (a) A violation of this section is an infraction.
(b) A court shall waive a fine for a violation under this seetion if:
(i) the registration for the vehiele was eurrent at the time of the eitation, and
(ii) the person to whom the eitation was issued provides, within 21 business days, evidenee that the lieense plate and deeals are properly displayed in eomplianee with this section.

Part 5. State Flags
63G-1-501. State flag -- Description -- Image -- Display.
(1) The state flag of Utah shall be a rectangle that has a width to length ratio of three to

five and contain the following:
(a) two irregular, horizontal lines dividing the flag into three separate segments, of which:
(i) the top segment:
(A) is located above the higher horizontal line; and
(B) is shaded in blue;
(ii) the middle segment:
(A) is located between the two horizontal lines;
(B) is shaded in white;
(C) at the higher horizontal line, takes the shape of a mountain with five peaks, the center peak being the tallest and following the shape of the highest point of the hexagon described in Subsection (1)(b); and
(D) at the lower horizontal line, follows the shape of the lowest point of the hexagon described in Subsection (1)(b); and
(iii) the bottom segment:
(A) is located below the lower horizontal line; and
(B) is shaded in red;
(b) one hexagon that:
(i) is shaded in blue;
(ii) contains a smaller gold hexagon outline; and
(iii) is placed within the center of the middle segment described in Subsection

(c) one beehive that:

(a) the beehive described in Subsection (1)(c) symbolizes industry, community, and the year 1847, the year in which pioneers first settled Utah;
(b) the Utah star described in Subsection (1)(d) symbolizes hope and the year 1896, the year in which Utah was admitted to statehood;
(c) the hexagon described in Subsection (1)(b) symbolizes the strength of Utah's people;
(d) the top segment described in Subsection (1)(a)(i) represents Utah's skies and symbolizes faith;
(e) the middle segment described in Subsection (1)(a)(ii) represents Utah's snowy mountains and peace, the peaks of which symbolize Utah's indigenous peoples; and
(f) the bottom segment described in Subsection (1)(a)(iii) represents the red rocks of Southern Utah and symbolizes perseverance and the state's unique landscapes.
(3) The state flag shall appear consistent with the following image:

(4) The state flag shall be available in the public domain and be displayed on all occasions when the state is officially and publicly represented, with the privilege of use by all citizens upon any occasion deemed fitting and appropriate.
(5) The lieutenant governor shall establish standards and specifications for the manufacture and display of the state flag.

Section $\{3\} 2$. Section 63G-1-503 is enacted to read:

## 63G-1-503. Historic state flag -- Description -- Image -- Display.

(1) The historic state flag shall be a flag of blue field, with the following device worked in natural colors on the center of the blue field:
(a) in the center a shield;
(b) above the shield and thereon an American eagle with outstretched wings;
(c) the top of the shield pierced with six arrows arranged crosswise;
(d) upon the shield under the arrows the word "Industry," and below the word "Industry" on the center of the shield, a beehive;
(e) on each side of the beehive, growing sego lilies;
(f) below the beehive and near the bottom of the shield, the word "Utah";
(g) below the word "Utah" and on the bottom of the shield, the figures "1847";
(h) behind the shield, there shall be two American flags on flagstaffs placed crosswise with the flags so draped to project beyond each side of the shield, the heads of the flagstaffs appearing in front of the eagle's wings and the bottom of each staff appearing over the face of the draped flag below the shield;
(i) below the shield and flags and upon the blue field, the figures "1896"; and
(j) around the entire design, a narrow circle in gold.
(2) The historic state flag shall appear consistent with any of the following three images:

(4) The lieutenant governor shall establish standards and specifications for the manufacture and display of the historic state flag.
(5) The historic state flag shall be displayed:
(a) on state property during legal holidays described in Section 63G-1-301, as deemed
appropriate by the governor; and

(b) on the capitol hill complex, as defined in Section 63C-9-102, during the annual general session of the Legislature.
(6) (a) The historic state flag may be displayed on state property for ceremonial purposes, so long as the flag is serviceable.
(b) The historic state flag shall be replaced by the state flag of Utah, as described in Section 63G-1-501, when the historic state flag is not displayed for ceremonial purposes.
(c) When displaying the historic state flag on public grounds in any location where the state flag of Utah, as described in Section 63G-1-501, is also displayed, the governmental entity responsible for the display of the flags shall ensure that the historic state flag is displayed beneath the state flag of Utah.

This bill takes effect on March 9, 2024.
) Section 5. Coordinating S.B. 31 with H.B. 26 -- Substantive and technieat amendments.

If this S.B. 31 and H.B. 26, License Plate Amendments, bothpass and become law, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Offiee of Legishative Researeh and General Counsel shall prepare the Utah Code database for publication on Mareh 9, 2024, by amending Subsection 41-1a-402(1) in H.B. 26 to read:
-"(1) (a) upon registering a vehiele, the division shall issue to the owner a standard lieense plate deseribed in Subseetion (1)(b) unless the division issues to the owner:
(i) a special group license plate in aceordance with Seetion 41-1a-418; or
(iii) an apportioned vehiele lieense plate in accordance with Seetion 41-1a-301.
(b) The division may offer up to four standard lieense plate options at one time, each with a different design as follows:
(i) two designs that ineorporate one or more elements that represent the state's economy or geography,
(ii) one design that refleets the state flag of Utah deseribed in Seetion 636-1-501; and
(iii) one design that commemorates a eurrent event relevant to the state or a signifieant anniversary of a historic event relevant to the state-
(e) The division shall offer:
(i) each design deseribed in Subsection (1)(b)(i) or (ii) for at least a 10-year period; and
