## Key Points

- Utah's population is one of the fastest growing in the nation.
- Utah's population is projected to increase by approximately:
- 587,000 this decade
- 653,000 next decade
- $90 \%$ of this population growth is occurring along the Wasatch Front and in Washington and Cache counties.

## Hispanic Population Growth - 1990s

Just less than onefourth of the half million increase in the Utah population in the 1990s was Hispanic.


## Hispanic Population Growth - Since 2000

Hispanics represent over a third of new Utah residents since 2000.


## Key Points

- Utah's population is becoming significantly more diverse:
- In 1990s, Hispanics accounted for $23 \%$ of Utah's population increase.
- Since 2000, Hispanics have accounted for 33\% of Utah's population increase.
