



may initiate any desired legislation and cause it to be submitted to the people for adoption upon a majority vote of those voting on the legislation



may initiate any desired legislation and cause it to be submitted to the people for adoption upon a majority vote of those voting on the legislation, as provided by statute.


Utah Initiatives on Ballot by Year



- Paid circulators statement




Step 1: Filing Application

Reasons lieutenant governor may reject:

- **1**. patently unconstitutional
- 2. nonsensical
- 3. could not become law if passed
- 4. contains more than one subject
- 5. unclear title
- 6. already proposed in last two years (+ signatures submitted)
