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Students Get Hands-on Experience – What It's Like to Serve As a Legislator

SALT LAKE CITY, September 11, 2003 - Thousands of Utah students will have the opportunity to learn more about how representative democracy works when state legislators, in a bi-partisan effort, visit classrooms September 22-26 during America's Legislators Back to School Week. Utah's event is being led by Representative LaVar Christensen and Senator David Gladwell on behalf of the Legislature.

Last year, 92% of the Utah State Legislature participated ranking #1 in the nation and reaching approximately 9,000 students. SCR 3, Resolution Designating Legislators Back to School Week, that passed in the 2003 General Session, supports the program in Utah.

In its fourth year, this program is designed to teach young people—the nation's future voters and leaders—what it's like to serve as an elected official: the processes, the pressures, and the debate, negotiation and compromise that are the very fabric of representative democracy. Organizers of the event hope that the students will value the importance of public service and become more active in civic affairs after legislators and students engage in activities regarding issues that are important to the students.

The National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL), a bipartisan nonprofit organization, is composed of the nation's state legislators and staff. America's Legislators Back to School Week is a product of NCSL's civic education initiative, Trust for Representative Democracy, and is funded by the US Department of Education. Based on the ideas and fundamental principles set forth by the framers of the Constitution, the Trust is designed to engage young people and build their understanding and support for America's democratic institutions.
