25	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
26	Section 1. Section 49-11-1301 (Effective 01/01/17) is amended to read:
27	49-11-1301 (Effective 01/01/17). Definitions.
28	As used in this part:
29	(1) "Amortization rate" means the amortization rate, as defined in Section 49-11-102,
30	to be applied to the system that would have covered the retiree if the retiree's part-time position
31	were considered to be an eligible, full-time position within that system.
32	(2) "Full-time" means a:

(a) regular full-time employee whose term of employment for a participating employer
contemplates continued employment during a fiscal or calendar year and whose employment
normally requires an average of 40 hours or more per week and who receives benefits normally
provided by the participating employer;
(b) teacher whose term of employment for a participating employer contemplates
continued employment during a school year and who teaches full time;
(c) firefighter service employee whose employment normally requires an average of
2,080 hours of regularly scheduled firefighter service per year; and
(d) public safety service employee whose employment normally requires an average of
2,080 hours of regularly scheduled public safety service per year.
(3) "Half-time" means a:
(a) regular employee whose term of employment for a participating employer
contemplates continued employment during a fiscal or calendar year and whose employment
normally requires an average of 20 hours per week and who receives benefits normally
provided by the participating employer;
(b) teacher whose term of employment for a participating employer contemplates
continued employment during a school year and who teaches half time;
(c) firefighter service employee whose employment normally requires an average of
1,040 hours of regularly scheduled firefighter service per year; and
(d) public safety service employee whose employment normally requires an average of
1,040 hours of regularly scheduled public safety service per year.
(4) "Phased retirement" means continuing employment on a half-time basis of a retiree
with the same participating employer [immediately after] following the retiree's retirement date
while the retiree receives a reduced retirement allowance.
Section 2. Section 49-11-1303 (Effective 01/01/17) is amended to read:
49-11-1303 (Effective 01/01/17). Phased retirement Eligibility Restrictions
Amortization rate.
(1) A retiree is eligible for employment with only one position for only one
participating employer under phased retirement following the retiree's retirement date if:
(a) the retiree:
(i) is eligible to retire and retires in accordance with this title;

64	(ii) has been employed full time, for not less than four years immediately before the
65	retiree's retirement date;
66	(iii) completes and submits all required retirement forms to the office; and
67	[(iv) completes and submits any phased retirement forms required by rules established
68	under Section 49-11-1308; and]
69	(iv) prior to the retiree's retirement date, completes and submits all required phased
70	retirement forms to the office; and
71	(b) the retiree and the participating employer enter into an agreement described under
72	Section 49-11-1304.
73	(2) A retiree shall begin phased retirement employment after the retiree's retirement
74	date but no later than 120 days after the retiree's retirement date.
75	[(2)] (3) For the period of the phased retirement:
76	(a) the retiree receives 50% of the retiree's monthly allowance;
77	(b) the participating employer employs the retiree on a half-time basis;
78	(c) a participating employer that employs the retiree shall contribute to the office the
79	amortization rate;
80	(d) the retiree or an alternate payee may not receive an annual cost-of-living adjustment
81	to the retiree's or alternate payee's allowance;
82	(e) any death benefits payable to a surviving spouse or other beneficiary shall be paid
83	based on 100% of the retiree's retirement allowance;
84	(f) the retiree may not receive any employer provided retirement benefits, service credit
85	accruals, or any retirement related contributions from the participating employer; and
86	(g) except as specified under this section, a retiree working under phased retirement
87	shall be treated in the same manner as any other part-time employee working a similar position
88	and number of hours with the participating employer, including:
89	(i) any non-retirement related benefits;
90	(ii) leave benefits;
91	(iii) medical benefits; and
92	(iv) other benefits.
93	(4) The office shall begin paying 100% of the retiree's retirement allowance on the first
94	day of the month following the month in which the office receives written notification and any

95	required supporting documentation that the retiree's phased retirement has been irrevocably
96	terminated.
97	Section 3. Effective date.
98	If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, this bill takes effect
99	upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of Utah
100	Constitution, Article VII, Section 8, without the governor's signature, or in the case of a veto,
101	the date of veto override.
