 - 15 amends provisions related to a student who willfully defaces or otherwise { injures } <u>damages</u>
 - 16 school property; and
- 2. Page 3, Lines 78 through 85:
 - 78 53A-11-806. Defacing or { <u>injuring</u> <u>damaging</u> school property Student's liability – Work
 - 79 program alternative.
 - 80 (1) [Any] <u>A</u> student who willfully defaces or otherwise { <u>injur</u>s <u>damages</u> any school property
 - 81 may be suspended or otherwise disciplined.
 - 82 (2) (a) [Any school district whose] If a school's property has been lost or willfully cut,
 - 83 defaced, or otherwise { <u>injurdd</u> <u>damaged</u> [may], the school may withhold the issuance of <u>an</u> official written
 - 84 grade [reports] report, diploma, [and transcripts] or transcript of the student responsible for the
 - 85 damage or loss until the student or the student's parent or guardian has paid for the damages.
