2. S.B. 68 Imputed Income Amendments (Anderegg, J.)

MOTION: Sen. Hillyard moved to amend S.B. 68 with Amendment #1 as follows:

- 1. Page 3, Lines 66 through 73:

 - 67 potential and probable earnings as derived from employment opportunities, work history,
 - 68 occupation qualifications, and prevailing earnings for persons of similar backgrounds in the
 - 69 community, or the median earning for persons in the same occupation in the same geographical
 - 70 area as found in the statistics maintained by the Bureau of Labor Statistics <u>, except that</u> <u>if a parent has no recent work history in a specified occupation or has not recently</u> <u>worked a 40-hour work week, the court may consider the parent's attempts at</u> <u>obtaining employment, and may impute income congruent with employment in a</u> <u>recent occupation or congruent with actual recent earnings</u>.
