 - 52 <u>coverage plan through the employment of the surviving spouse or, if the surviving spouse</u>
 - 53 remarries, the employment of the spouse of the remarried surviving spouse, the employer:
 - 54 (A) shall pay the employer share of the premium costs and, if the health coverage is a
 - 55 <u>high-deductible plan, the employer share of any contribution into a health savings</u> account for
 - 56 <u>the surviving spouse and dependent children as described under Subsections (1)(a)</u> <u>and (2); and</u>

- a plea to any of the above accepted by the court and held in abeyance.
- 2. Page 4, Line 115 through Page 5, Line 123:
 - (9) (a) The following serve as an application for a permanent criminal stalking
 - injunction limiting the contact between the defendant and the victim:
 - 117 <u>(i) a conviction for:</u>
 - 118 (A) stalking;
 - (B) attempt to commit stalking;
 - 120 { (C) conspiracy to commit stalking; or
 - 121 (D) solicitation to commit stalking; or
 - (ii) a plea to any of the offenses described in Subsection (9)(a)(i) accepted by the court
