13	and staff support to the Early Childhood Utah Advisory Council (the council);
14	 expands the duties of the council to include duties previously fulfilled by the
15	commission;
16	 requires the council to report certain information to the executive officers of the
17	Department of Health and Human Services, the Department of Workforce Services,
18	and the State Board of Education;
19	 extends the sunset date of the council from 2026 to 2029; and
20	makes technical changes.

88	(i) the quality, effectiveness, and availability of existing services for children in early
89	childhood and the coordination of those services;
90	(ii) gaps and barriers to entry in the provision of services for children in early
91	childhood; and
92	(iii) community-based solutions in improving the quality, effectiveness, and
93	availability of services for children in early childhood;
94	(b) seek regular and ongoing feedback from a wide range of entities and individuals

95	that use or provide services for children in early childhood, including entities and individuals
96	that use, represent, or provide services for any of the following:
97	(i) children in early childhood who live in urban, suburban, or rural areas of the state;
98	(ii) children in early childhood with varying socioeconomic backgrounds;
99	(iii) children in early childhood with varying ethnic or racial heritage;
100	(iv) children in early childhood from various geographic areas of the state; and
101	(v) children in early childhood with special needs;
102	(c) study, evaluate, and report on the status and effectiveness of policies, procedures,
103	and programs that provide services to children in early childhood;
104	(d) study and evaluate the effectiveness of policies, procedures, and programs
105	implemented by other states and nongovernmental entities that address the needs of children in
106	early childhood;
107	(e) identify policies, procedures, and programs that are impeding efforts to help
108	children in early childhood in the state and recommend changes to those policies, procedures,
109	and programs;
110	(f) identify policies, procedures, and programs related to children in early childhood in
111	the state that are inefficient or duplicative and recommend changes to those policies,
112	procedures, and programs;
113	(g) recommend policy, procedure, and program changes to address the needs of
114	children in early childhood;
115	(h) develop methods for using interagency information to inform comprehensive policy
116	and budget decisions relating to early childhood services; and
117	(i) develop strategies and monitor efforts concerning:
118	(i) increasing school readiness;
119	(ii) improving access to early child care and early education programs; and
120	(iii) improving family and community engagement in early childhood education and
121	development.
122	(3) In fulfilling the council's duties, the council may request and receive, from any state
123	or local governmental agency or institution, information relating to early childhood, including
124	reports, audits, projections, and statistics.
