1. Committee Business

2. Adoption of Study Items

The committee will review the proposed interim study item list for the 2023 Transportation Interim Committee, may modify the study item list, and will adopt the study item list ([JR7-1-401](#)). The committee may authorize the committee chairs to independently open one or more committee bill files throughout the interim period on topics related to the adopted study item list ([JR7-1-602](#)).

3. Sunset review: Utah State Scenic Byway Program

Absent further action by the Legislature, [Utah Code Title 72, Chapter 4, Part 3](#), which creates the Utah State Scenic Byway Program, will be repealed January 2, 2025. The committee will conduct a sunset review of the statute and determine if it should be reauthorized for up to 10 years, with or with amendments, or allowed to expire.

4. Sunset review: Motor vehicle business regulation advisory board

Absent further action by the Legislature, [Utah Code Ann. § 41-3-106](#), which creates an advisory board related to motor vehicle business regulation, will be repealed July 1, 2024. The committee will conduct a sunset review of the statute and determine if it should be reauthorized for up to 10 years, with or without amendments, or allowed to expire.

5. Public Transit

The committee will hear an overview presentation from the Utah Transit Authority and the Utah Department of Transportation regarding current transit projects.

6. Coordinated Mobility Services

The committee will discuss coordinated mobility service coordination and delivery.

7. Transit Stations

The committee will study the successes and opportunities of the Housing and Transit Reinvestment Zone (HTRZ) program in its two years of existence. The committee will also study parking needs and requirements around transit stations, discuss Station Area Plans (SAPs), and Transit-Oriented Development (TOD).

8. Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) Update

The Utah Department of Transportation will give an update on IIJA-funded projects in Utah, including presenting on a federal Corridor Identification and Development Program grant opportunity involving a passenger train from Boise to Las Vegas.
