Section 1. Section 41-6a-715 is amended to read:

41-6a-715. Controlled-access highways -- Prohibiting use by class or type of traffic -- Traffic-control devices.

- (1) A highway authority may regulate or prohibit the use of [any] a controlled-access highway within [its respective] the highway authority's jurisdiction by any class or [kind] type of traffic [which is found to be] that the highway authority determines is incompatible with the normal and safe movement of traffic.
- (2) [A] For the safe movement of traffic during predicted or existing adverse weather conditions, a highway authority may restrict traffic on a highway to [specific vehicle equipment of capabilities due to weather conditions for the safe movement of traffic.]
