

Resolution Regarding Dr. Martha Hughes Cannon Commemorative Stamp

LONG TITLE

General Description:

This resolution urges the United States Postal Service to consider a commemorative stamp in honor of Dr. Martha Hughes Cannon.

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the state of Utah:

WHEREAS, on July 1, 1880, Martha Hughes graduated with her Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree at 23 years old;

WHEREAS, she went on to earn a bachelor's degree in Pharmacy from the University of Pennsylvania and a bachelor's degree in oratory from the National School of Elocution and Oratory;

WHEREAS, Utah became the 45th state in the United States of America in 1896;

WHEREAS, Dr. Cannon was elected to the Utah State Senate in the state's first election in 1896;

WHEREAS, Dr. Cannon became the first woman senator from Utah and the first woman state senator in the United States; and

WHEREAS, as senator, Dr. Cannon sponsored bills to provide compulsory education of deaf and blind children, to create a state board of health, and to protect the health of women
