- 24 Section 1. Section **1** is enacted to read:

## 25 <u>53E-4-207.</u> Firearm safety <u>minimum</u> standards and instruction.

- 24 (1) As used in this section:
- 25 (a) "Firearm" means the same as that term is defined in Section 76-10-501.
- 26 (b) <u>"On or about school premises" means the same as that term is defined in Section 76-10-505.5.</u>
- 28 (2) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the state board shall make rules that establish <u>minimum</u> standards for firearm safety instruction as described in <u>Subsection (4).</u>
