8 This bill:

- 9 ▶ provides that June 19, called Juneteenth National Freedom Day, is a legal holiday in Utah;
- 10 ▶ consistent with other legal holidays in Utah, provides for recognition of Juneteenth National Freedom Day on the preceding Friday or subsequent Monday if the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, respectively; and
- 13 ▶ amends parent-time schedules in relation to Juneteenth National Freedom Day.
