- (2) Under circumstances not amounting to an offense listed in Subsection (4), an actor commits care provider sexual relations with an individual experiencing a {vulnerable adult } vulnerability if:

 - . (i) the actor is employed by, volunteers for, or otherwise assists a health care facility or human services program; or
- 82 (ii) the actor is a health care provider;
