4 **General Description:**

5 This bill addresses a program that offers a discounted annual pass to state parks for  
6 qualified veterans.

7 **Highlighted Provisions:**

8 This bill:

9 ▶ creates a program, as funding allows, that offers a discounted annual pass to state parks to  
qualified veterans who are residents of the state;

11 ▶ requires the Division of State Parks to offer the discounted veteran pass at a reduction of at least  
25% of the price of a state parks annual day-use pass; {and}

13 ▶ provides for the automatic repeal of the discounted annual pass program after three years;  
and

13 ▶ grants rulemaking authority to establish the program.

16 **Money Appropriated in this Bill:**

17 ▶ This bill appropriates \$300,000 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2026, all of  
18 which is from the General Fund.
