## SB0235 compared with SB0235S01

- 19 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*
- Section 1. Section **73-22-4** is amended to read:
- 73-22-4. Ownership of geothermal resource -- Lands subject to chapter.
- 21 (1)
  - (a) Ownership of a geothermal resource derives from an interest in land and not from an appropriative right to geothermal fluids.
- 23 (b) Notwithstanding Section 73-22-3, the owner of surface land owns the rights to the underlying geothermal resource unless the rights to the geothermal resource have been reserved by or conveyed to another person.
- 26 {(2)} Subsection (1)(b) does not apply to school and institutional trust lands as defined in Section 53C-1-103.
- 29 (2) This chapter shall apply to all lands in the [State of Utah] state, including federal and Indian lands to the extent allowed by law. When [these] federal or Indian lands are committed to a unit agreement involving lands subject to federal or Indian jurisdiction, the division may, with respect to the unit agreement, [deem] consider this chapter complied with if:
- 31 (a) the unit operations are regulated by the United States; and
- 32 (b) the division finds that conservation of geothermal resources and prevention of waste are accomplished under the unit agreement.
- 37 Section 2. **Effective date.**

This bill takes effect on May 7, 2025.
