Cellular device prohibition. 25 (1) As used in this section: 26 (a) "Cellphone" means a handheld, portable electronic device that is designed to be operated using one or both hands and is capable of transmitting and receiving voice, data, or text communication by means of: 29 (i) a cellular network; 30 (ii) a satellite network; or 31 (iii) any other wireless technology. 32 (b) "Cellphone" includes: 33 (i) a smartphone; 34 (ii) a feature phone; 35 (iii) a mobile phone; 36 (iv) a satellite phone; or 37 (v) a personal digital assistant that incorporates capabilities similar to a smartphone, feature phone, mobile phone, or satellite phone. 39 (c) "Classroom hours" means: 40 (i) time during which a student receives scheduled, teacher-supervised instruction that occurs: 42 (A) in a physical or virtual classroom setting; 43 (B) during regular school operating hours; and 44 (C) as part of an approved educational curriculum. (ii) "Classroom hours" does not include: 45 46 (A) lunch periods; 47 (B) recess; 48 (C) transit time between classes; 49 (D) study halls unless directly supervised by a qualified instructor; 50 (E) after-school activities unless part of an approved extended learning program; or 51 (F) independent study time occurring outside scheduled instruction.

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- . (i) "Emerging technology" means any other device that has or will be able to act in place of or as an extension of an individual's cellphone.
