49	(a) <u>"Program funds" means the same as that term is defined in Section 53F-2-302.1.</u>		
50	(b)(i) "School district" means a group of public elementary or secondary educational		
51	institutions that provide K-12 education under the same local school board.		
52	(ii) "School district" does not include a charter school.		
53	(c) "Student learning English" means a student, currently enrolled at a public elementary		
54	or secondary educational institution, whose most recent score on an English language		
55	proficiency assessment is a 1 or 2.		
56	(2)(a) A school district may submit an application to the state board to receive		
57	emergency funding if enrollment, at a school within the school district, of students		
58	learning English increases by 50% or more above the previous three-year average		
59	enrollment for students learning English in the school.		
60	(b) An application submitted under Subsection (2)(a) shall:		
61	(i) demonstrate substantial need for the emergency funding:		
62	(ii) include the percentage by which the school's student learning English enrollment		
63	exceeds the previous three-year average for the school; and		
64	(iii) demonstrate that the school has insufficient existing funds to adequately support		

65	the increased student learning English enrollment.
66	(3) The state board shall:
67	(a) establish and oversee the application process to award emergency funding; and
68	(b) prioritize applications and distribute funding based on:
69	(i) the greatest percentage increase in students learning English enrollment in the
70	school; and
71	(ii) the severity of the financial need of the school.
72	(4)(a) The state board shall draw the emergency funding described in Subsection (2)(a)
73	from the program funds.
74	(b) The state board may not draw program funds of more than \$5,000,000, per fiscal
75	year, for the emergency funding described in this section.
