Definition -- Filing of foreign judgments -- Post-judgment interest rate -- Status of foreign judgments. 24 25 (1) As used in this part, "foreign judgment" means any judgment, decree, or order of a court 26 of the United States or of any other court whose acts are entitled to full faith and credit 27 in this state. 28 (2) A copy of a foreign judgment authenticated in accordance with an appropriate act of 29 Congress or an appropriate act of Utah may be filed with the clerk of any district court 30 in Utah. The clerk of the district court shall treat the foreign judgment in all respects as 31 a judgment of a district court of Utah.
