Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah: 19 Section 1. Section 41-6a-1635 is amended to read:

41-6a-1635. Windshields and windows -- Tinting -- Obstructions reducing

21 visibility -- Wipers -- Prohibitions.

- 22 (1) Except as provided in Subsections (2), (3), and (4) a person may not operate a motor 23 vehicle with:
- 24 (a) a windshield that allows less than 70% light transmittance;
- 25 (b) a front side window that allows less than 35% light transmittance, with no more than 26 a 5% variance observed by a peace officer metering the light transmittance;
- 27 (c) any windshield or window that is composed of, covered by, or treated with any 28 material or component that presents a metallic or mirrored appearance;
- 29 (d) any sign, poster, or other nontransparent material on the windshield or side windows

31	(i) a certificate or other paper required to be so displayed by law; or
32	(ii) the vehicle's identification number displayed or etched in accordance with rules
33	made by the department under Section 41-6a-1601; or
34	(e) any debris, frost, or other substance that materially obstructs the operator's view.
35	(2)(a) A person may not operate a motor vehicle with an object or device hanging or
36	mounted in a manner that materially obstructs the operator's view.

52	(b), a motor vehicle with tinting or nontransparent material on any window shall be
53	equipped with rear-view mirrors mounted on the left side and on the right side of the

55	vehicle.
56	(6)(a)(i) The windshield on a motor vehicle shall be equipped with a device for
57	cleaning rain, snow, or other moisture from the windshield.

50	(b) A windshield wiper on a motor vehicle shall be maintained in good working order.
51	(7) A person may not have for sale, sell, offer for sale, install, cover, or treat a windshield
