LONG TITLE
General Description:
This bill addresses imitation firearms that have been altered to have the appearance of a
firearm.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
<ul> <li>creates the criminal offense of unlawful alteration of a toy, look-alike, or imitation</li> </ul>
firearm, which prohibits an individual from removing or substantially altering certain
federally required markings; and
<ul> <li>creates the criminal offense of a minor possessing an unlawfully altered toy, look-alike,</li> </ul>
or imitation firearm by a minor, which prohibits a minor from possessing a toy,
look-alike, or imitation firearm that has had certain federally required markings removed
or altered.

<b>76-10-533</b> , Utah Code Annotated 1953
<b>76-10-534</b> , Utah Code Annotated 1953
Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section <b>76-10-533</b> is enacted to read:
76-10-533 . Unlawful alteration of a toy, look-alike, or imitation firearm.
(1)(a) As used in this section, "toy, look-alike, or imitation firearm" means a
non-firearm device regulated under 16 C.F.R. Part 1272.
(b) Terms defined in Sections 76-1-101.5 and 76-10-501 apply to this section.
(2) An actor commits unlawful alteration of a toy, look-alike, or imitation firearm if:

32	(a) the actor intentionally or knowingly removes or otherwise substantially alters:
33	(i) the orange color solid plug that is affixed to the muzzle end of the barrel of a toy,
34	look-alike, or imitation firearm in accordance with 16 C.F.R. Secs. 1272.1,
35	<u>1272.2, and 1272.3(a);</u>
36	(ii) the orange color marking that is affixed to the exterior surface of the barrel of a
37	toy, look-alike, or imitation firearm in accordance with 16 C.F.R. Secs. 1272.1,
38	<u>1272.2, and 1272.3(b);</u>
39	(iii) the transparent or translucent materials of a toy, look-alike, or imitation firearm
40	that permit the observation of the toy, look-alike, or imitation firearm's complete
41	contents that are used on the toy, look-alike, or imitation firearm in accordance
42	with 16 C.F.R. Secs. 1272.1, 1272.2, and 1272.3(c); or
43	(iv) the white or bright coloration of the entire exterior surface of the toy, look-alike,
44	or imitation firearm that is applied to the toy, look-alike, or imitation firearm in
45	accordance with 16 C.F.R. Secs. 1272.1, 1272.2, and 1272.3(d); and
46	(b) as a result of the removal or other substantial alteration described in Subsection (2)(a),
47	a reasonable person would determine that the toy, look-alike, or imitation firearm has
48	the appearance of a firearm.
49	(3) A violation of Subsection (2) is an class C misdemeanor.
50	Section 2. Section <b>76-10-534</b> is enacted to read:
51	76-10-534 . Possession of an unlawfully altered toy, look-alike, or imitation
52	firearm by a minor.
53	(1)(a) As used in this section, "toy, look-alike, or imitation firearm" means the same as
54	that term is defined in Section 76-10-533.
55	(b) Terms defined in Sections 76-1-101.5 and 76-10-501 apply to this section.
56	(2) An actor commits possession of an unlawfully altered toy, look-alike, or imitation
57	firearm by a minor if the actor:
58	(a) is younger than 18 years old; and
59	(b) intentionally or knowingly possesses a toy, look-alike, or imitation firearm that has
60	been unlawfully altered in violation of Section 76-10-533.
61	(3) A violation of Subsection (2) is an infraction.
62	Section 3. Effective Date.
63	This bill takes effect on May 7, 2025.
